As another phase of the academic session begins, we look forward to your cooperation in encouraging children to come to the offline school regularly, participate in academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities and make their learning more effective and enjoyable.

Kindly note:

- The school has resumed offline classes for students of classes XI to XII. You are requested to ensure that students are well informed of the standard operating procedures to be followed while at school. Students must wear face masks at all times and maintain social distancing.
- The school is starting with the Mock Pre-Board for class XII from 21st October, 2021. It is mandatory for all the students to appear in this examination.
- CBSE will soon begin the process of registration of students for class XI. The personal and the academic details have already been asked to fill by the students. Parents are requested to follow all timelines related to submission of documents and signing of the LOC (List of Candidates). Change of subject will not be allowed after CBSE registration.
- It is important that students are regular in attending classes. It has been observed that some students are irregular for the classes scheduled on a particular day. Parents are requested to ensure that the child is present for all classes. In case the child is not able to attend classes due to some unavoidable reason, a mail should be sent to the class teacher clearly stating the reason for absence.
- Any application mailed to the school must be addressed to the Principal, giving the name of the student, her/his class and section and admission number.
- In the case of the medical leave, a medical certificate with the photocopy of the doctors' prescription should be attached.
- Kindly ensure that your mobile numbers are updated in school.
- Any change of Address, Telephone Number, etc. must be brought to the notice of Class Teacher immediately or the School Accounts Department through mail.
- Please ensure that you pay the school fees on time. To avoid any inconvenience, it is advisable to pay the fee before the 7th of the first month of every bi-month. For further details please contact the school accounts department.

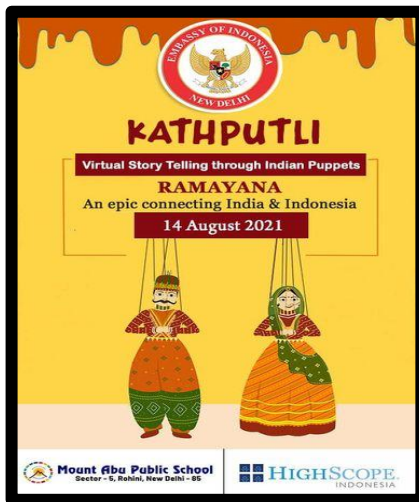
NATIONAL EVENTS

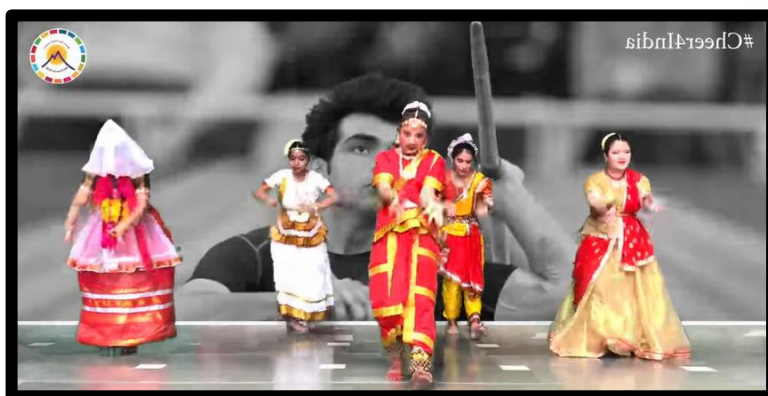

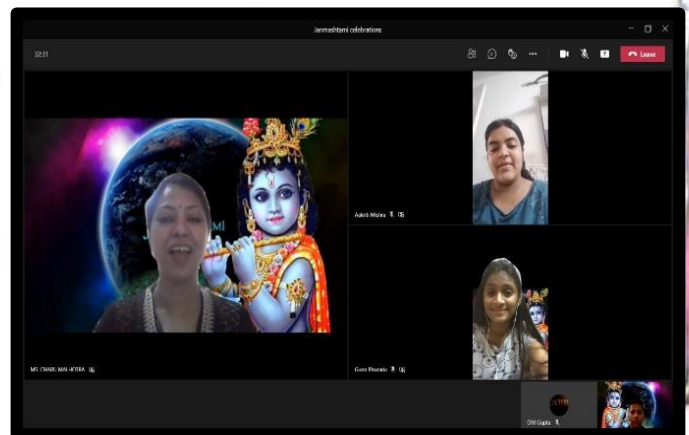
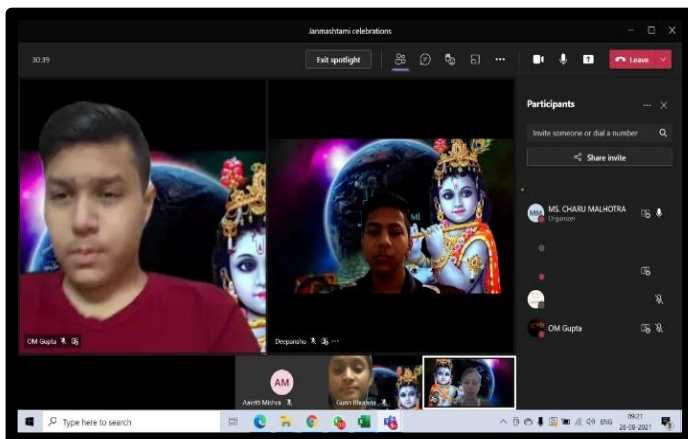


ASSEMBLIES

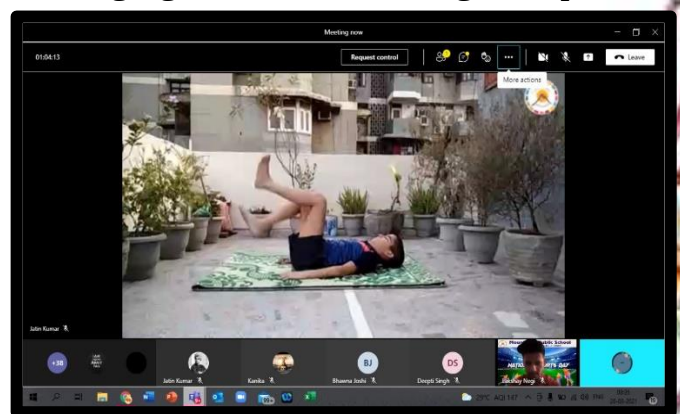

of thanks was presented by Deepti Singh of class 12 to express her gratitude to all those who made this special event a big success.

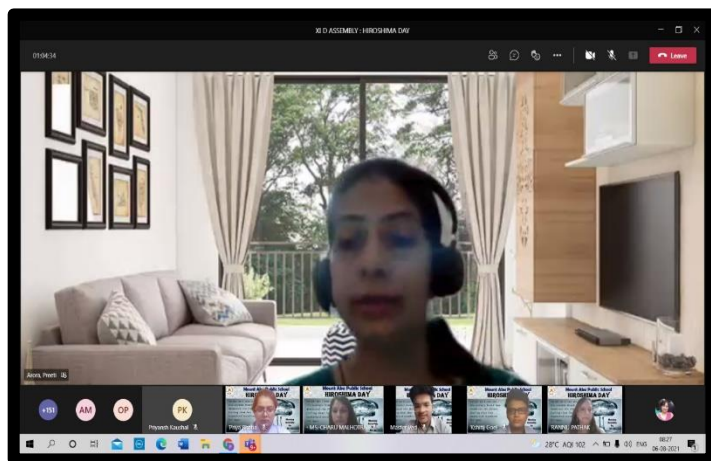
HIROSHIMA DAY

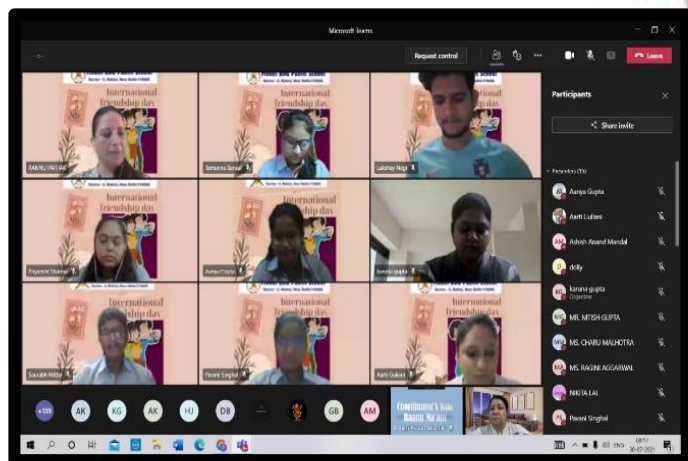

WORLD CONSERVATION DAY

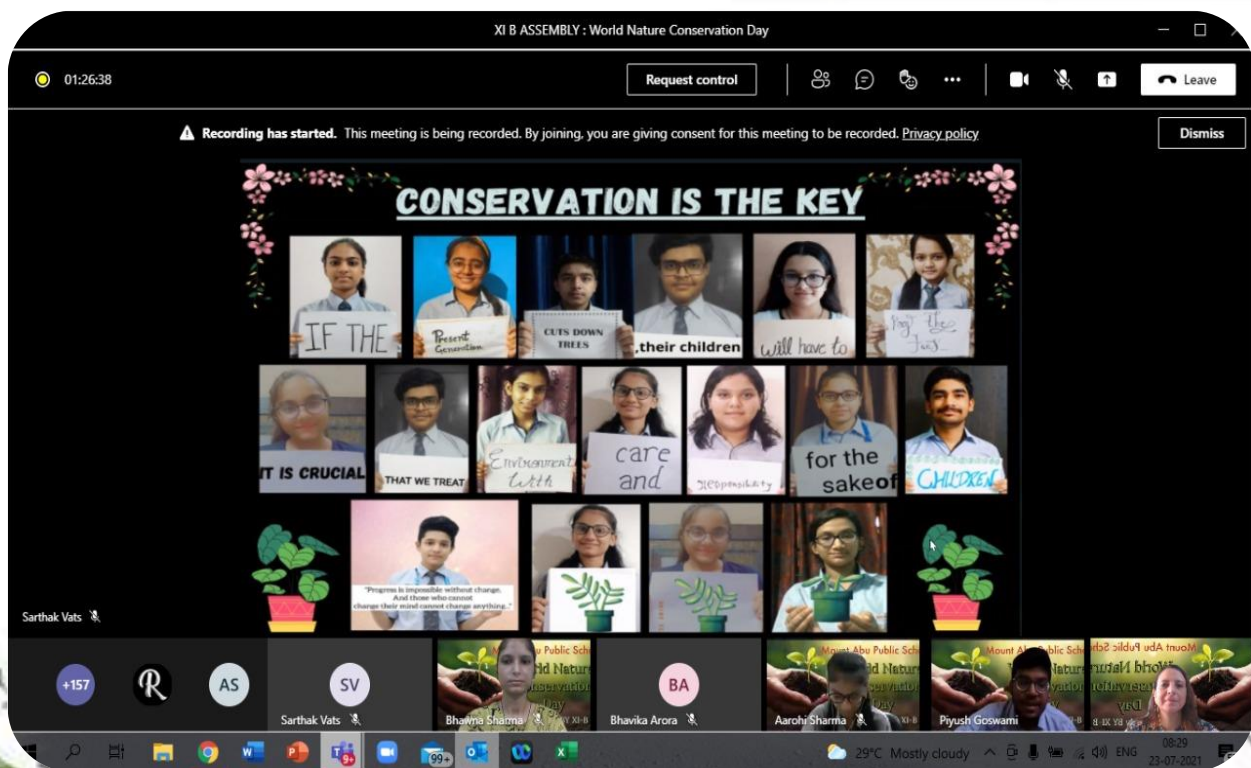
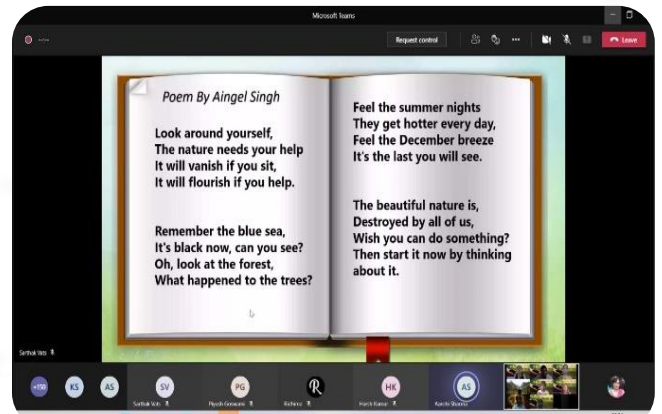
“Love and care for Earth and it will care for you more”.

LIFE SKILL SESSION ON WASTE MANAGEMENT

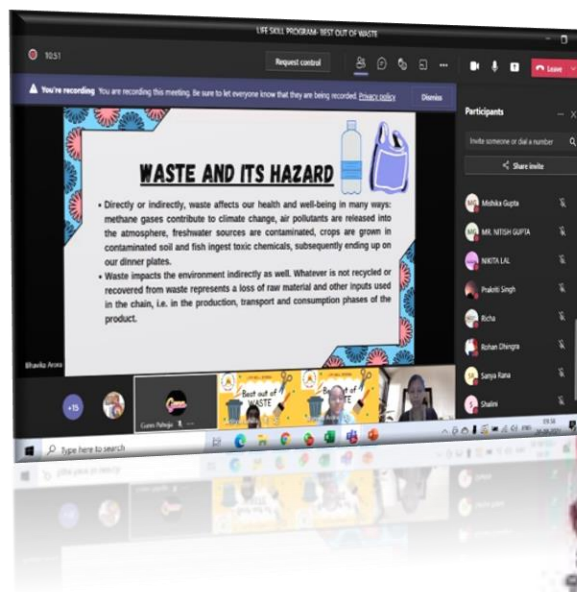
“Waste is not waste until we waste it”

kitchen garden is a lifesaver indeed, as it assures us about the quality and source of what we consume to nourish our body. Certainly, it was a very informative session for everyone.

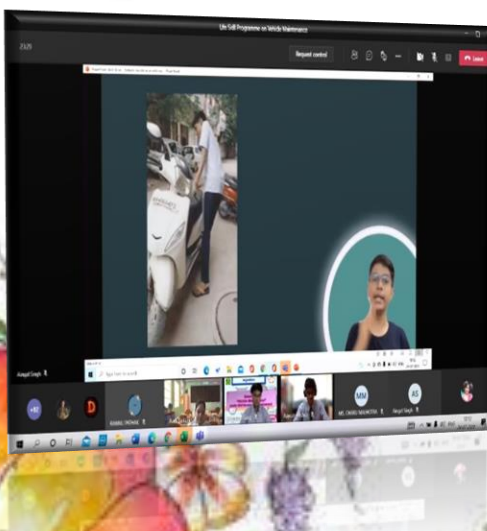
VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

the students as they will be driving their vehicles soon.

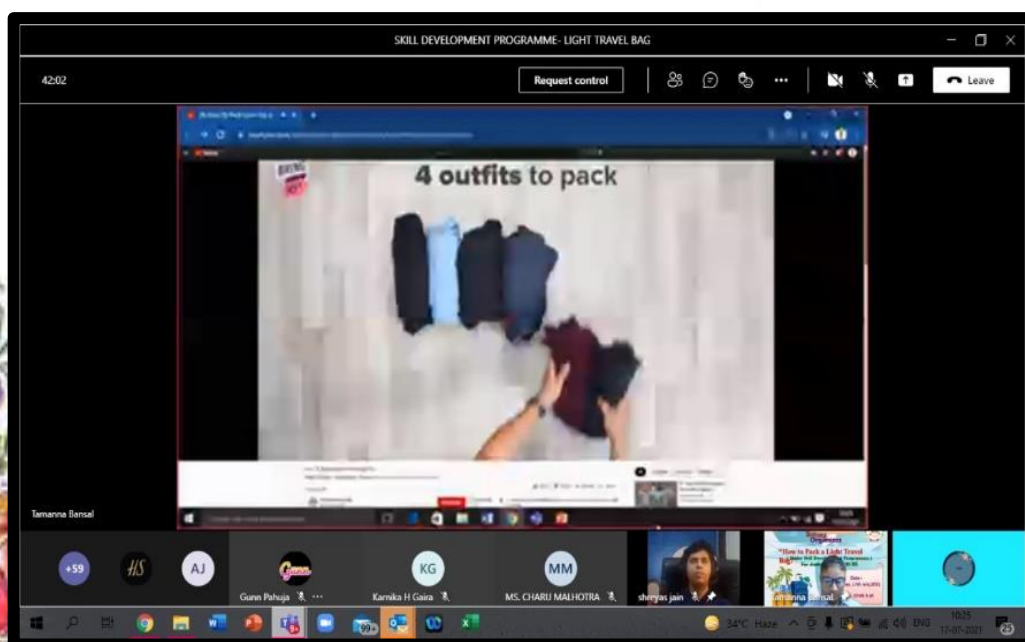
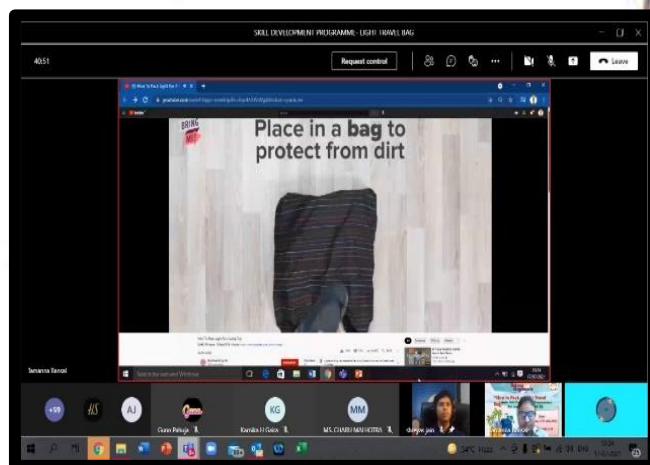
HOW TO PACK A LIGHT TRAVEL BAG
